#SaveOrangeSchemes Our Emergency Appeal

In March 2020 we found ourselves in a strange and previously unimaginable situation – a national lockdown. We were devastated to have to close Challengers schemes and see the isolation that we've fought so hard to end for disabled children and their families become an upsetting daily reality.

No one knew how long the lockdown would go on for, but one thing we did know was that within just a few months, we would see a significant shortfall of £150,000 from the forced cancellation of our fundraising events and activities. Like many charities, businesses and individuals, the unprecedented impact of the coronavirus pandemic hit Challengers hard and had an immediate effect on our financial position, leaving the future of the charity seemingly in the balance.

We rely on donations for half of our yearly income, and we knew that without this funding we simply wouldn't be able to continue our work. But that wasn't an option. Challengers services are a lifeline for thousands of families across the South, so we knew that when the threat of the pandemic had passed, we had to be in a position where we could re-open schemes to provide vital play and social opportunities for our young people.

In early April we started an emergency appeal on Crowdfunder and asked people to help us #SaveOrangeSchemes. We didn't know how people would respond, but the support we received was overwhelming.

Over 1140 people donated towards the campaign and we raised an incredible £67,748!













The support shown for our appeal has been phenomenal. Supporters set up virtual raffles and events, took on running and cycling challenges, and even shaved their heads to raise money to help save orange schemes, which is testament to how much the community values Challengers and the important service we provide for disabled children and their families.

For 40 years, Challengers has been breaking down barriers to play by providing safe spaces for disabled children and young people to have fun and make friends.

Today, our charity and our Challengers family face an unprecedented threat. The isolation that we have fought so hard to end for disabled young people and their families is now an upsetting, daily reality.

When the pandemic threat has passed, we must be in a position to re-open as many services as we can, providing vital play and social opportunities for our young people, and giving their families access to crucial respite from their care responsibilities.

Our COVID-19 Response Team




Not all superheroes wear capes...

Though not quite as exciting as the Avengers, our COVID-19 Response Team "assembled" at the end of March 2020 to devise a plan for how we could safely re-open our schemes. With ever-changing government restrictions and the complex medical conditions of our disabled children and young people to consider, this was no mean feat, but the team quickly got to work and implemented new and creative solutions to get schemes up and running again.



Shannon and Ella spent countless hours researching and reading government guidelines and created a COVID-19 manual for Challengers staff with the help of a volunteer Compliance Consultant, full to the brim with new policies and procedures for operating our schemes. The manual constantly needs to be reviewed, so each week they go through updates with staff to ensure that they understand the new policies and are compliant with all of the new procedures, as this is integral to keeping children and staff safe.



Risk assessments and audits



Updated training


As Training Manager, Ella has been in high demand delivering lots of new training on topics like safeguarding, moving people and behaviour support which takes into account enhanced COVID-19 risks. The lack of routine during lockdown was very difficult for disabled children to adapt to, leading to the emergence of challenging behaviours in many of the children we support, so thorough and relevant staff training on how to handle this has been more important than ever.


...and a whole lot of cleaning and tidying

Local Landmarks Half Marathon heroes

Our brilliant team of London Landmarks Half Marathon runners were devastated when the event, due to take place in March, was cancelled. They were determined not to let their training and fundraising efforts go to waste, so they decided to run 13.1 miles around their own local landmarks instead! In total they raised an incredible £7,832...you are our heroes!

Community Foundation for Surrey

In April we were extremely grateful to receive a grant of £4,173 from CFS towards essential IT costs which enabled us to continue operating during the pandemic. In addition to this, we received a significant grant of £22,000 towards our Head of Operations' salary to help us adapt our services and continue offering activities safely.






NFU Mutual funding

But in order to deliver our schemes in a safe manner, things look a little different at the moment.

"The young people have been really happy to be back at Challengers and have adjusted to the masks and all the cleaning! I love walking into scheme and suddenly forgetting COVID exists because there are young people and staff running around with massive smiles on their faces.

I am proud to have set up a Sunday session for Guildford Youth, which doubles the opportunities for young people to come each week. I have a brand new Sunday leadership team, and we are increasing the number of young people we can have each session.

I have missed having activity providers come in to scheme to run activities. I have been in contact with someone with a gorgeous therapy cat who will hopefully be coming to visit our schemes sometime next year!"







Spotlight on...the Basingstoke Play team: Mark Carr, Operations Manager

"Sadly we have been unable to run our Basingstoke Play scheme since COVID hit due to venue restrictions, but the Basingstoke staff team, led by Georgina Fitzpatrick, stepped in to address staffing shortages by successfully running a full-capacity scheme at Eastleigh Play this year.

The team and children were completely new to one another, and there was the added pressure of operating in a brand-new venue, but the scheme has gone from strength to strength, and their commitment and willingness to travel from one side of the county to the other daily has meant Eastleigh Play families have been able to access a much-needed service that they rely on.

Staff have had to re-think how they can bring fun, learning and new experiences to the children alongside barriers of PPE and the intrusive aromas of antibac sprays and gels, which can be triggering for many children who are sensitive to smells and environmental factors. What's more, the team have been inspiring role models to new starters and have gone above and beyond their roles to induct new Eastleigh Play staff, ensuring there is a seamless transition for families."




Challengers goes virtual

They love getting to show their skills to each other, be it drumming a solo part, their awesome chopping skills, busting some dance moves, or even building spaceships from spaghetti and marshmallows!

I look forward to every Zoom session knowing that for 60-90 minutes there will be lots of smiles, laughs and learning new things. It's such a nice image when everyone joins the session waving and saying hi to each other."

The virtual sessions reminded my daughter that there was still a world outside her window.



16-year-old Matthew has loved joining the virtual sessions and having fun with his orange friends while at home. His mum Jenny tells us how life has been during lockdown, and how our online sessions helped

Since joining Farnham Youthscheme, Matthew has really loved the trips out, in particular Legoland and going on the railways and picnics. Matthew has blossomed at Challengers through the activities and trips out, and has now moved from having one to one support to being independent on scheme.

Despite this, even though Matthew has been at Challengers for many years, no-one has ever really heard him talk.

Over lockdown we have coped ok because despite his difficulties, Matthew is a lovely placid and easy-going young man. Although initially, he was asking "What are we going to do today?" all the time, we then settled into a routine of walks and household chores. Matthew does understand about the virus but he has been missing his friends and social contact dreadfully.

The weekly Zoom sessions from Challengers have helped us stay in touch, especially as Matthew has been unable to go to school. As soon as the children and the scheme leader April appear on the screen Matthew is desperate to see them – it was the highlight of Matthew's week during lockdown! What has been amazing and fascinating is that we've actually heard Matthew talking to others for the first time. I really hope this will help Matthew when he goes back to Challengers to make a connection with others on scheme.

The Challengers weekly Zoom chats have helped us have a real connection with the outside world, and I don't know what we would have done without them.



Meet Fran

Fran is 16 and has been attending Challengers in Alton and Farnham since the age of 4. Her mum Louise explains how much Challengers means to them and how our virtual sessions have allowed Fran to be her usual sociable and happy self at home.

During lockdown it's been tricky at times, we started off with home schooling and it was working well but as time has gone on it's got harder and harder.

When you have a child like Fran it can be very difficult as she's asking lots of questions all day long and at other times she has seemed depressed and quiet, which is very unlike her as she is normally a happy girl.



She's found it very hard and really misses people, so when we found out about Challengers' Zoom sessions it was such a boost! I remember when I told Fran about the virtual sessions it made me cry as I saw her face absolutely light up. Those virtual Zoom meetings have been absolutely great for her, she looks forward to them every week and is really happy afterwards.

Fran has desperately missed Challengers. It has always been her place, and she loves her friends and the activities. It has been such an important part of her life as so few places like Challengers exist. It's somewhere Fran can go to just be herself and be accepted for who she is.




Life on Zoom!










Everyone turned up in their best orange outfit for our Orange Day in October...even the pets got involved!


